Notes for Johannas Bernardus Henricus Zwart:

Johannas Bernardus Hendricus Zwart, the Founder of the Zwart Family in Holland, was born at or near Borken, Wesphalia in the year 1768. He learned the trade of a carpenter and builder, in accordance with the custom of the times. He started, after serving an apprenticeship at his trade in his native country, to go to chief cities in his own and foreign lands, visiting also the East Indies and China, so that he became a master in his trade when yet a young man. At the instance of a Mr. Huidekooper for whom he had been working in the East Indies, he came with a gentleman to Holland, where he soon acquired a reputation as a skillful mechanic and builder, and erected many large and tasteful buildings. Among those which gave him the greatest reputation were the buildings known in Holland as the "Chinese Tents" constructed entirely of lumber, in the neighborhood Baarn in the Province of Utrecht.

On the 17th of June, 1796, He married Hendrena Muller, daughter of Bernardus Muller of Groningen and Agatha Timmer and he then settled in Weesp in Horth Holland. The couple was the origin and first generation of the Zwart Family in Holland.

Notes for Lambertus Johannas Zwart:

This biography of his mother and father was written by Johannas "Bernardus"+ Hendricus Zwart (b.9-9-1827) about 1866.

Lambertus Johannas Zwart was the son of Johannas Bernardus Hendricus Zwart of Borken and Hendrena Muller of Weesp. He was born on the 15th day of March, 1800 at Weesp in the province of North Holland now the Kingdom of the Netherlands. He received as thorough an education in the schools of his native land, as the times allowed to children of the middle class not aiming to professional life. He must have been an apt scholar. for I have now in my possession a premium awarded to him by the school Commission, being a treatise or essay on "Religion and the Existence of God". This was awarded to him before he was eleven years of age. From his Grandmother Agatha Timmer, widow of Bernardus Muller, a most pious and exemplary member of the Roman Catholic Church to which the whole of our family did belong and I pray to God may continue to belong unto the end of time, through the divine gift of faith, and the redemption bought for all by the Passion and death of Our Lord Jesus Christ, he received very early and continuous instruction in all matters of faith, as many and many times he told me, and was at an early age admitted as a member of the Church which membership he always maintained actively and conscientiously. His own great ambition afterwards was to rear a family of real and devoted Catholics, and this he succeeded in doing, if the old saying is true that ye shall know the tree by its fruit. He was a natural mechanic and in accordance with the custon of the times learned the business of his father, and soon became a competent architect and builder. At the age of 22 years he married his half cousin, Cecelia Maria Allegonda Muller, the daughter of Doctor Johannas Leonardus Muller of Groningen.

My mother was born on the 15th of August, 1788 on the Feast of the Assumption, and she was baptized the same day by Rev. W.D. Andrie. My mother was a half cousin to my father, as his mother, Hendrina Muller, born March 6, 1776, was the daughter of Agatha Timmer and Bernardus Muller who was the brother of Doctor Johannas Leonardus Muller. My said Grandmother married on the 26th day of June, 1796 with Johannus Bernardus Hendricus Zwart, who died May 21, 1839 at the age of 71 years. I remember him very well, as well as both my grandmothers. My mother's father died when I was but a little child. After the death of my mother's mother, and sometime in 1844 or 1845, I think, this Bible was transferred from my mother's side of the family to my father's side.

My father then entered into a business partnership with his brother-in-law, Bernardus Johannas Muller, for manufacturing purposes. The partnership lasted for over 15 years until 1839. As contemplated they commenced the manufacturing of all kinds of soap on a comparatively small scale on the Blauw Burgwal in Amsterdam. As his enterprising spirit required a more extended field of operation, they purchased, a few years later, a finely situated piece of property on the river "Vecht" a couple of miles above Weesp and erected thereon a beautiful brick building of 3 stories height with 12 feet wide hall in the center, forming a double house with a separate residence on either side of the hall for the families of the two members of the firm. They also erected the necessary manufacturies on the ground and appear to have been fairly successful until in the winter 1829 after they had their winter's supply for the manufacturie in store, fire destroyed all their stock and manufacturies without.

however, affecting the residence nearby.

After this they sold their property above Weesp and moved in the town itself where they remodeled some old buildings formerly used for other manufacturies and soon had their factories in operation on a more extensive scale, combining machinery for the manufacture of oil, with that for making soap oil being the chief ingredient used in the manufacture of soap. For a few years the motive power was that of horses, but in 1835 or perhaps even before that (my recollection as to the precise year not being very strong) he conceived the idea of making steam power available for a motive power of all the machinery which up to that time had compelled the employment of 24 horses.

I have a faint recollection of dissensions on this subject by my father and in the incredulous manner in which the matter was frequently spoken of by many of his fellow citizens who on such occasions used no very complimenting terms as to the danger coupled to steam machinery said to be detrimental to the safety of the people at large. It being a new thing, it was considered very unwise to run the risk and to bring danger to his neighbors doors but he persisted in his plans. About the year stated he bought two steam engines; one to be used to drive the oil mill on a more extensive scale, and the other to drive a flour mill. In due time he had both in successful operation and therby gave employment to more than 60 men in his native town. Later, to work the machinery to better acvantage than his limited means permitted he conceived the idea to establish a corporation consisting of a large number of stockholders and thus to obtain sufficient means for his purposes.

This was an unheard of plan in those days but he himself drew up the Articles of Association and carried the same in successful operation. The business was in charge of a board of directors whereof he was one. A copy of

these articles of incorporation is now in my possession. After a while, however, men of loss enterprise obtained the control of the board of directors and facting his sphere of action too much controlled by their influence, he readily sold out his mack in the corporation which was then in successful operation.

In November 1940, he removed with his family to the city of Amsterdam, where for a time he engaged in the business of a factor but soon after he bought new machinery and erected a large steam flour mill with a high pressure engine of lifts horse power outside the city. Such steam engines were even then considered too dangerous to be allowed within corporate limits. He place his mill in successful operation until 1846, when through an unintentional and technical violation of the excise laws on the part of the miller who had charge of the granding department, his mill with all its contents was sequestered and placed in the hands of the millionities. For over a year, he appealed to the higher authorities, and even at an audience with the King in person, was to no avoid for a long time. At last he was granted his request and the property was restored to him lifts business, however, was destroyed and as he was of "Pairrot" and "Anti-Orange" family, disgusted with transity exercised by the lowest officials as well as the highest, he was very loud in his denunciations of the King in the Palace in Amsterdam, he said to the King when requested to leave his presence:

"Sir, you may order me out of this room, but take care that the people do not turn you out of this Palace, for I will spend all my money to let the people of Holland and the Potentiates of Europe know what a tyrant the King of Holland is."

The result of this language, however, and his indomitable spirit of opposition to opposition, in whatever shape it greatened itself, rendered it impossible for him to carry on business successfully. After sometime in the occupation as a "Factor" again, he resolved to leave his native land and to seek a more congenial home and measurablegs in foreign lands, in the latter end of 1847 he determined to leave Holland with his family to locate in the United States. In the spring of 1848 in pursuance thereof the family left their old home in the city of Austredium on the 14th of March, to go my rathroad to Rotterdam and from there by steambout to Antwerp from where they were to start to New Orleans. Notes for Johannas "Bernardus" Henricus Zwart: AUTOBIOGRAPHY OF JOHANNAS "BERNARDUS" HENRICUS ZWART

I was the third child and second son of Lambertus Johannas Zwart and Cecelia Maria Allegronda, his wife, a daughter of Dr. J.L. Muller. At the request of my wife and oldest daughter, I now proceed to write down such parts of my life as I now remember, this September 16, 1883.

I was born on Sunday night, September 9, 1827. (Died in Ironton, Missouri on July 9, 1893 and interred at Pilot Knob, Missouri) The hour was twelve o'clock midnight at my parents residence in Weescarspel and hour above Weesp and situated on the border of the River Vecht which translated means "Fight", an arm of the Rhyn which empties into the Zulder Zee an hour off at Muyden, and also three hours off at Amsterdam, in the "Ey". On Sunday, September 9, 1827 the first steamboat that was ever seen in Holland, called "Mercurius", came up the river from Amsterdam on a trial trip and passed my father's residence a few hundred yards away, thus doing honor to the new born babe, and turned back and down the river to Amsterdam. Years later I have seen this same boat making regular trips between Amsterdam and Leeuwarden.

My first recollection is of an occurence which took place one evening in the winter of 1829 or 1830 after my parents had removed to Weesp but before the old house had been rebuilt. There was a basement entrance to the house, the family was returning from an evening visit to my uncle's house, when my father, mother, and Elizabeth, my father's sister, and the children, each of the grown people carrying one child, came to the door of the basement. Whilst my father was trying to unlock the door, which was a very difficult matter by reason of the lock and key being old and rusty and not having been used for a long time prior to that occasion, we all stood out there in the shadow, or rather deep darkness of the old house in the cold night. I was carried by my Aunt Elizabeth. The whole scene impressed itself so strongly on my tender infantile mind that no subsequent event of my whole life ever left a deeper or more lasting impression thereon.

My youth, and up to 1840, when my parents removed to Amsterdam, was passed in the usual exercises and pasttime of that age amongst which walking, running, skating, riding and swimming found the chief place and without offending truth it may be said that many youthful tricks were often, not without cause, charged to our account, to wit; my brother, my cousin and I were quite proficient skaters and riders, but swimming required many years to master fully with all its tricks.

Many a time I have travelled on skates making fifty miles a day and doing it inside of three hours. Eight miles in half an hour we travelled often. When seven years old I was sent to "Citizens School", a public school for those who were able and willing to pay. Another branch whereof called the "Free School" was gratis to all. After three years attendance at this school and in the year 1838, I was sent to the "French School" as it was called, being an institution at the place of residence and where instructions in the French language was the chief object. Here I stayed two years to wit: until my parents removed to Amsterdam in 1840. During this time I also received instructions in drawing, which I was fond of and in playing the violin, which I disliked very much and never learned. In Amsterdam I went to a private "French Academical School" carried on by a Mr. Bigot, a Frenchman. Here I stayed until I was fifteen years old. After this I entered the office of my father until I secured a place with another person. During this time also, my brother and I both received private instructions in

English and German.

My first employment was at the office of Mr. Bylwalt, a broker in cotton, but he suspended after a few months operation in 1844. I was engaged as "Course-Clerk" by the banking firm of Oppenheim Brothers and Company at Amsterdam. As such clerk my business was to ascertain the relative value of exchange at Amsterdam on the different cities of Europe.

For six months I was kept at this work and raised to the position of "Aval-Clerk" having charge of all exchange, and to copy the same in a large book. Also I prepared settlements for the first of each month on all sales and purchases of stocks and bonds during the preceding month. This put me in contact with the Cashier, and at his request, although unknown to our employers I became charged with the receiving and forwarding of all monies, coin, bullion, bonds and stocks, from and to other points. A very responsible position! I also assisted the Cashier in all matters as a full assistant, and thereby became conversant with all duties of that position.

Sometime in 1845, the Cashier became entangled in disastrous speculation and was discharged. I was appointed Cashier in his stead, and continued in the performance of the duties of that place until January, 1848, when I resigned in order to accompany my parents to America. That I performed the duties of the trust confided in me to the full satisfaction of my employers is evidenced by their certificate to that effect which they subscribed as a recommendation if ever I should need the same. But before giving me this certificate they strove to induce me to remain with them offering me a yearly salary in advance until it should have reached the maximum amount paid to Cashiers in other banking houses. But the pleasure of a free life in America was beckoning me too strongly there, that I should have parted with the hope of their enjoyment at any price.

And so the whole family came to America in 1848 as heretofore detailed in my father's history. After my father's family had removed to Keokuk, my father insisted that I should learn the builder and contractors business, which I did. On the 27th day of December 1850 I was united in the holy bonds of wedlock with Miss Cornelia Maria Johanna Henriet, (Died January 2, 1897 and interred at Pilot Knob, Missouri) who on the day of our marriage was just 22 years old. The marriage ceremony was performed by Rev. I. M. Villars, Roman Catholic priest of St. John's Church, corner of Second and Blondeau Streets in Keokuk, Iowa, a marriage contracted in due obedience to the laws of God and the Holy Roman Catholic Church. After this marriage I kept a register of family births, deaths and marriages which as I have no paper in this bible to translate I now fasten to the Bible, September 16, 1883. Signed. B. Zwart

I now continue the history of my family and relations on this second day of December, 1883, and take the subsequent births and deaths from another family Bible in the English language which I procured for that purpose in 1863 at Patrick Fox, Roman Catholic Bookstore in St. Louis, Missouri.

In 1862, whilst the happiness of our home circle was as near to perfect as can be in this world, other cares and troubles arose from the War of Rebellion, and ever since the spring of 1861, going on, caused me many a day of care and trouble on account of the almost total suspension of business not flowing from the war. For over a year I had been struggling and was then still struggling on, in the old business, hoping for peace, which had been promised within ninety days. After the beginning of the war and thereafter, off and on every few months, until about the late summer of 1862 there was little or nothing being done in the lime business. I carried on this business as superintendent for a firm consisting of my mother, sister and sister-in-law, in a lime kiln built by their husbands before my father's death, on an improved plan for which I had obtained a patent from the United States Government in March 1858 at Carondelet. So it became necessary for me to look out for other employment.

Just about this time Governor Gambles' Proclamation was published requiring the enrollment of all able-bodied men, between twenty and forty-five, into the militia of the State of Missouri, and I duly enrolled. After several unsuccessful efforts by Colonel Stafford to perfect an organization of the regiment, I was at last appointed for that purpose, with the promise of a Captain's Commission. Inside of two weeks I had earned my commission by the organization of the Second Regiment Enrolled Missouri Militia, consisting of eight full companies ready for active service at an early warning. During the fall and winter my Company "F" was in active service for some time, guarding the gunboats and building yard below Carondelet.

The organization of this Regiment later in July 1863 caused my appointment as second clerk of the Provost

Marshal's offfice for the enrollment of men for the draft in the Third Congressional District of Missouri. This office was located at Ironton, Missouri to which place I went on the fourth day of July 1863. My family followed on August twenty second. Colonel James A. Greason who was chief clerk of the office and with whom I got acquainted whilst he was Assistant Quarter Master U. S. Army at Jefferson Barracks, south of St. Louis, recommended me for the appointment to Captain Charles W. Noell, Provost Marshal, and placed me in possession of stacks of blanks, a number of books and a lot of office furniture on the succeeding day, with the request to put everything in proper trim and to put the office in running order at the earliest possible day, which I did.-

As Colonel Greason shortly afterwards was promoted to Commissioner of the Board of Enrollment, I was promoted to his place as Chief Clerk, which position I held until after the war, when the office was abolished. The books and papers were turned over to Colonel Henry C. Wright, Provost Marshal of the First District at SI Louis, and former Lieutenant Colonel of the Second Regiment Enrolled Missouri Militia which had been organized by me and who now requested me to take the position of Chief Clerk in his office at St. Louis. This offer, however, I declined having already made arrangements with Colonel Greason to enter together in the law practice at Ironton for which I had qualified myself by careful study and review of the teachings in 1850 received from Colonel Samuel R. Curtis at Keokuk, Iowa. In October, 1865 I made application to John W. Emerson, Judge of the then Judicial Circuit for admission to the bar. After examination by Judge William Carter and J. W. Emerson, I was admitted to the practice of law and on the first of Nomember, 1865 entered into partnership with Colonel Greason.

1867, in the latter end of March, 1867, I was appointed by President Andrew Johnson on the recommendation of Honorable Thomas E. Noell, Collector of Internal Revenues, to a position for the 2nd Collection District of Missouri. After having qualified and received my Commission, I entered in the discharge of the duties of the office on the 22nd day of May, 1867, if I recollect correctly, and remained in office until the latter end of June, 1869 when I was relieved by Lindsay Murloch, appointee of President U. S. Grant. When I took charge of the office there was an amount of \$14,686 in uncollected taxes on the list, and when I was relieved the amount was only about \$306.

Whilst I was in the office in 1869, a number of friendly disposed gentlemen were desirous that I should announce myself as a candidate for Congress to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Honorable Thomas E. Noell, several County Conventions appointed delegates to the District Convention with instructions to cast their vote for me. After mature reflection and considering that the greatest happiness is realized in a quiet family life, I publicly announced that I would not be a candidate. If I had announced, I have no doubt but what my friends would have secured my nomination, and a nomination would have been equal to an election. Viewing the past since that time, I do not regret my refusal to become a candidate there being more deserving and abler men in the party, although they failed to get the nomination. Upon my withdrawel the Convention nominated General James R. Mc Cormack and he was elected.

1869. After being relieved as collector of Internal Revenue, I was in 1869 appointed by the Circuit Court of the United States Commissioner for the Eastern District of Missouri. Later on in the division of the State by Act of Cngress, I was again appointed by the Circuit for the Eastern District, which appointment I resigned in June 1881 to enable me to practice as an attorney in the prosecution of claims against the government. In April 1882 I was reappointed such Commissioner by the same Court, and continued to perform the duties thereof having prior to the reappointment quit the prosecution of claims against the government.


